Discipleship Year - Hub Leader

Job Purpose: The DY Hub leader at Trinity will supervise the DY gap-year program, catering to the needs of all DY students. This role fosters the students' growth as disciples of Jesus, refining their spiritual skills and talents as they engage in ministry settings. The leader extends warm welcome, nurturing, and skill-building support for the students.



Population Served: DY Students.

Reporting: Reports to the Rector, the Diocese of Toronto, and collaborates with Trinity staff.

Type: Half Time (20 hrs/wk) **Salary:** \$25,000-\$28,000

Duties and Responsibilities:

Promoting and Recruiting (15% ~ 3 hrs/wk)

- Advertise the DY Program both locally and internationally.
- Network with the Diocese of Toronto to seek potential students.
- Promoting the DY by actively seeking participants from churches and organizations.
- Utilize social media to raise awareness about the DY.
- Collaborate with New Wine to recruit international students.
- Seek additional church or ministry partners/placements as the program grows.
- Champion the DY in schools, youth events, and diocesan gatherings.

Supporting and Nurturing (35% ~ 7 hrs/wk)

- Acquire housing for DY Students.
- Make arrangements for all DY students as they relocate to Mississauga.
- Arrange for parish mentors to support the DY students.
- Meet regularly with DY students for coaching, encouragement, goal setting, and prayer.
- Collaborate with Trinity's Care Coordinator to provide pastoral support to DY Students.
- Ensure all students abide by the DY expectations as laid out in the Hub Handbook.
- Ensure all students and volunteers are current with Trinity's Screening in Faith process.

Teaching & Liaising (50% ~ 10 hrs/wk)

- Teach the DY curriculum as adapted from the DY Coursebook (8 hours/week)
- Invite guest speakers and presenters to enhance the learning experience.
- Ensure that all necessary equipment and resources are available for course content.
- Attend discipleship events & conferences when possible.

- Organize retreats & weekends away (see Hub Handbook for examples)
- Organize an overseas mission trip.
- Fundraise for projects and trips as needed.
- Ensure a healthy working environment and relationship with ministry supervisors.
- Track and submit expenses on time.
- Meet regularly with Rector for oversight, guidance, mentoring and prayer
- Attend weekly staff meetings (in person or virtual TBD)

Qualifications:

- Strong Christian faith and commitment to personal spiritual formation and growth
- Rich theological understanding (degree or diploma in Theology an asset)
- Training and experience in Christian Ministry
- Strong interpersonal, communication, organizational and listening skills
- Cultural sensitivity for people of diverse backgrounds
- Knowledge of reporting protocol and referral processes to access youth support/resources
- Genuine compassion and respect for all persons
- Conflict resolution skills
- Understanding of him/herself as a Christian role model
- Ability to set and maintain personal boundaries
- Ability to work with a team and/or alone
- Meet regularly with Rector who will provide oversight, guidance, mentoring and prayer
- Attend weekly staff meetings (in person or virtual TBD)
