Embracing the Future at Trinity Streetsville!

Did you know that innovation, flexibility, and resilience are vital to Trinity's congregational character? Over our 182-year history, we've faced significant setbacks, including two destructive fires (150 years apart!) and a global pandemic. Yet, through God's grace, the people of Trinity have continued to meet challenges and envision new ways to share and demonstrate God's love.

When the pandemic hit in March 2020, Trinity quickly shifted from in-person services to online worship. We met online for 18 months, pre-recording services and airing them Sunday mornings on our YouTube channel.

Many parishioners returned to attend in person when the church reopened in September 2021.

visitors joined us after having first explored and experienced Trinity online. We introduced a live stream option (real-time broadcasting) when we reopened, knowing that some parishioners intended to continue watching online. In addition, new viewers continue to join us online each week!

Whether people attend church in person or online, we want to provide a way for everyone to be welcomed, nurtured, and involved in life at Trinity. The growth of our online congregation, in particular, calls for innovative



ways to foster worship, prayer, and discipleship while creating opportunities to give and serve. Together, our in-person congregation and online community will continue advancing our mission to love Jesus, live like Jesus, and lead others to Jesus.

Recognizing the need to nurture and develop our in-person and online congregations, Trinity is strategically investing in human resources, programming, and technology. This investment will expand our capacity to respond to growth's exciting opportunities and challenges.

To support us, the Anglican Diocese of Toronto has awarded Trinity a multi-year Congregational Growth grant from its Ministry Allocation Fund (MAF). The generous grant provides \$225,000 in the first two years, representing a significant portion of the funding needed to hire a full-time Online Engagement Director, part-time Welcome and Connections Director, and part-time Production Assistant.

The grant from the Diocese enabled us to move forward immediately with recruitment for these vital positions. After a diligent search, we're excited to announce that we have successfully filled these new roles from within the congregation! Congratulations to Elizabeth Archer, Sally Hurkmans, and Dale Birch. Please read page 2 to meet our new team members. The Diocese grant will help bridge the gap as Trinity continues to grow, along with congregational financial giving. Trinity parishioners will also have the opportunity to help advance our vision through special contributions.

Elizabeth Archer, Online Engagement Director

You may recognize Elizabeth Archer from the many times she has warmly welcomed people at the start of a Sunday service. Since she and her husband Elliot joined Trinity in 2013, Elizabeth has volunteered in several other ministries, including Stephen Ministry, children and youth ministry, and as a Board member. On May 29, Elizabeth joined the Trinity staff in the new role of Online Engagement Director.



"My vision is that anyone who tunes in online with Trinity truly becomes 'tuned in' to the life of the church," says Elizabeth. "By this I mean they feel known, connected, supported, and cared for. They also must have opportunities to give, through time, gifts, and resources, to support the health and vitality of our church."

Elizabeth's primary responsibilities include:

- Providing pastoral care/discipleship support to online parishioners.
- Creating and maintaining engaging social media content.
- Managing the Trinity website.
- On-camera hosting for the Sunday service livestream (starting in the fall).
